




My brothers and sisters,

Today's readings place before us one of the deepest human experiences: thirst. In the first reading from Exodus, the Israelites are physically thirsty. They are in the desert. They are tired.

They are afraid. And they begin to complain: "Why did you ever make us leave Egypt?" They even question whether the Lord is with them at all. "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" That question echoes in every generation. In the Gospel, we meet another thirsty soul — the Samaritan woman at the well. She comes to draw water in the heat of the day, likely alone, likely avoiding others. But beneath the surface of her daily routine, there is another kind of thirst — a spiritual thirst. A thirst for love. For acceptance. For truth. For something lasting. And Jesus meets her there. He says to her, "Give me a drink." Can you imagine? The Son of God asks for something. Jesus makes Himself vulnerable. He allows Himself to appear needy. But of course, He is not the one who is truly thirsty. Jesus is drawing her out. He is leading her to discover her own deeper thirst — and the One who can satisfy it. Lent places us in a spiritual desert. Like Israel, we may find ourselves asking: Is the Lord really with me? Why is this happening? Where is God in this struggle? Like the Samaritan woman, we may come to the well carrying hidden burdens — disappointments, regrets, wounds, sins, loneliness. We try to satisfy our hearts with many things: success, recognition, distractions, comfort, even unhealthy relationships or habits. But the truth remains: we are still thirsty. Only Christ satisfies. Notice how Jesus does not shame the woman. He does not condemn her. He speaks truth, yes — He names her broken relationships — but He does so to heal, not to humiliate. Jesus reveals that He knows her completely... and still engages her in conversation. That is how God works with us. He knows everything about us. Every failure. Every doubt. Every sin. Yet He remains at the well waiting for us. Lent is not about proving ourselves to God. It is about allowing God to reach our thirst. The Samaritan woman's transformation is beautiful. She comes to the well alone, but after encountering Jesus, she leaves her water jar behind. She runs back to the town. She becomes a missionary. "Come see a man who told me everything I have done." The jar she carried every day — she leaves it. Because she has found something greater.

When we truly encounter Christ, we leave something behind. Old patterns. Old fears. Old identities. We stop defining ourselves by our past and begin living from grace. And then we become witnesses. This parish, this community, is filled with people who are thirsty — whether they know it or not. Thirsty for hope. Thirsty for meaning. Thirsty for mercy. Thirsty for love. The question is: have we allowed Jesus to meet us at the well? Have we taken time this Lent to sit with Him in prayer? To let Him speak to our hearts? To go to Confession and allow Him to tell us, with mercy, "I know you — and I love you"? When the Israelites doubted, God still provided water. When the Samaritan woman was broken, Jesus still offered grace. And when we are weak, distracted, or doubtful, Christ still waits for us. "Is the Lord in our midst or not?" "Look at the Cross. Look at the Eucharist. Look at the mercy poured out again and again. Yes — God is in our midst. This Lent, let us stop running from the well. Let us bring Him our thirst. Let us allow Him to give us living water.

And then, like the Samaritan woman, let us go and tell others:

"I have met the Christ"

Amen.




Marriage
