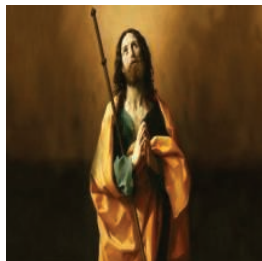

Dear St. Philip Neri Family and Friends, we give praise and thanks to God for His graces and blessings! There is a saying that we often hear: *"Don't sweat the small stuff."* While there is some wisdom in that, today's Gospel reminds us that God certainly pays attention to the small things. In fact, the Kingdom of God often begins in what seems insignificant. Jesus tells us that the Kingdom is like a mustard seed, **"the smallest of all the seeds,"** and like a little yeast that a woman mixes into flour until the whole batch is leavened. At first glance, both images seem unimpressive. A tiny seed. A handful of yeast. Neither appears capable of changing much. Yet that is exactly the point. God delights in taking what is small and bringing about something extraordinary. The mustard seed becomes a large bush where the birds find shelter. A little yeast silently transforms an entire batch of dough. Neither happens instantly. Both require time. Both work quietly. Both reveal the hidden power of God. Many people today think that only grand gestures matter. We admire the extraordinary, the famous, the dramatic moments. But the Christian life is rarely lived that way. Holiness is almost always formed through ordinary, daily faithfulness. It is the parent who teaches a child to pray before bedtime. It is the student who chooses honesty over cheating. It is the parishioner who quietly visits someone who is lonely. It is the person who forgives when it would be easier to hold a grudge. It is taking five minutes to pray before the Blessed Sacrament. It is offering a smile to someone who is hurting. It is making the Sign of the Cross before a meal, even in a crowded restaurant. These may seem like very small things, but in God's hands they become seeds of His Kingdom. If you notice throughout the Gospels, God consistently works through what is small. He chooses a stable in Bethlehem instead of a palace. He calls ordinary fishermen instead of scholars. He takes five loaves and two fish to feed thousands. He compares His Kingdom to a tiny seed and to a little yeast hidden in flour. God does not need large beginnings. He simply asks for willing hearts. Sometimes we become discouraged because we think our efforts are too small to make a difference. We wonder if our prayers matter, if our acts of kindness change anything, if anyone notices our attempts to live the Gospel. Jesus would say they do. Just as no one watches yeast working inside the dough, God's grace is often invisible. Just as the mustard seed grows underground long before anyone sees it above the surface, God is working in ways we cannot yet recognize. Saint Paul tells us in the second reading that even when we do not know how to pray, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us with inexpressible groanings. Even our weakest prayers become powerful because God's Spirit is at work within us. This is precisely the spirituality of **St. Thérèse of Lisieux**, the Little Flower. She never founded a religious order, traveled the world, or performed spectacular miracles during her lifetime. She simply discovered what she called her 'Little Way.' She believed that every small act, when done with great love, became pleasing to God. A hidden sacrifice, a kind word, a smile offered when she did not feel like smiling, performing ordinary duties faithfully—these were the little seeds that grew into great holiness. St. Thérèse understood that the surest path to heaven is not found in doing extraordinary things but in allowing God to transform our ordinary lives through love. That should give us great confidence. We do not have to accomplish extraordinary things. We simply need to be faithful in the ordinary things. Every small act of love, every hidden sacrifice, every sincere prayer, every act of forgiveness becomes another seed planted in the Kingdom of God. The beautiful thing is that others notice these small acts more than we realize. They see the peace with which we face suffering. They notice our kindness when others are harsh. They witness our generosity, our patience, our joy, and our faith. Those simple, everyday actions become a living witness to Christ. They may even inspire someone else to draw closer to God. **St. Teresa of Calcutta** beautifully echoed this same truth when she said, *"Not all of us can do great things. But we can do small things with great love."* Her words could almost be a commentary on today's Gospel. The Kingdom grows one small act of love at a time. This week, when you wake up each morning, ask yourself one simple question: "What small seed can I plant today that will allow God's Kingdom to grow in someone else's life?" Perhaps it is a phone call to someone who is lonely, a word of encouragement, an act of forgiveness, a quiet prayer for someone in need, or simply showing kindness to a stranger.

I pray for you every day, especially at Mass. Please pray for me.

Please invite someone to Mass this week.

Once again this summer we will be working on several important projects. Remodeling & updating 2 girl's rest rooms. The 5th grade classrooms (trailers contained within brick walls, installed in the 90's) are receiving new ceiling, lighting, ventilation, electrical outlets, flooring, windows, carpeting, and fresh paint. New carpeting will be installed throughout our school hallways. ZeroEyes, a proactive visual gun detection and situational awareness platform, working alongside digital security cameras to rapidly detect dangerous suspicious situations, providing valuable time for individuals to move to safety. DefenSafe/DefenseLite security film will be installed on glass entrances on 1st floor windows throughout our Church and school. The cost of these projects is approx. \$400,000.00, we are only able to undertake these projects because of your support. Time and again, you respond with open hearts and remarkable generosity. Thank you for your faithful support of our parish, we are truly grateful.

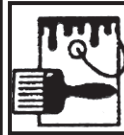
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
